

Preliminary list of questions for New Partnerships Initiative in the online application form

Applications to New Partnerships Initiative must be written and submitted via an online application portal. A link to the form will be available between 17 March and 19 May 2022.

If you want to start planning your application before 17 March, this document contains the main questions that you will be asked to answer in the application form.

Please note that this list is preliminary. The questions and their order might be slightly different in the application portal.

End date (YYYY/MM/DD)	Maximum 18 months
Sum applied for in SEK	Minimum SEK 50,000 and maximum SEK 750,000
Specify where the project activities will take place	Project activities can take place online, in Russia and in Sweden. Physical activities must include participants from both countries.
Project summary	Write a project summary of max. 800 characters. It should tell us what you want to do, how and why.
